



Did You Know?

According to WalletHub, the amount of property loss caused by residential building fires on Thanksgiving is 26 Million each year. That's dollars, not turkey feathers.

Scary Stat

The **average cost** (globally) of a ransomware attack in 2022, according to IBM, was **more than 4.5 Million**. And that does <u>not</u> include any ransom payments made.

But hey, good news, that's down from 4.6 million last year.

Not so fast.

IBM also found that the frequency of ransomware increased 41% (from 7.8% in 2021 to 11% in 2022). So let's not pop the champagne quite yet.

What can you do?

The study found that stolen or compromised credentials and ph!shing were the most common and costliest attack vectors.

So encourage good password hygiene and enforce strong password policies. Also be sure to provide security awareness training so everyone in your company knows what to look out for, what to do, and what not to do.

And remember, always Think Before You Click.


